

God's Covenant of Life

When God made Adam and Eve, he put them in a beautiful garden. God gave them everything he made to use and enjoy. But God held back only one thing.




















Choosing to Trust and Obey

Dear Family,

This morning your child learned that God established a covenant relationship with Adam. God promised him life on the condition that he obey God's command. God told him not to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when he ate of it he would surely die. This tree provided the opportunity for Adam to choose whether or not he would trust God and obey him. Preschoolers learned that God's children are able to trust and obey only by the power of God in their lives. They need his saving grace through Jesus in order to make choices that glorify their loving heavenly Father. The children were encouraged to trust God and do what he commands.



Projects for you & your child this week . . .



- Borrow a library book about trees and use it to identify the trees in your neighborhood. Praise God for all the different trees he has made.
- Provide paper, pencils, an ink pad and some packaged wipes. Have each person press his or her thumb on the ink pad and then on the paper. Use the pencil to add arms, legs and a head with facial features and hair, write each family member's name under his or her thumbprint portrait. Talk about how each thumbprint is different from anyone else's in the whole world. Talk about how special God has made each person, starting with our first human parents, Adam and Eve.
