deserve to be treated like a son. I will ask my father to make me one of his hired workers.”























and ask God for forgiveness.



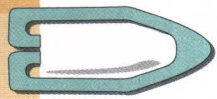
