and the glory, for ever. Amen. (KJV)






I Can Pray Every Day

Circle the pictures that show times you can talk to God.














I Can Pray Like This







Dear Family,

Today your child learned that prayer was an important part in the life of Jesus, and he taught his followers how to pray. Preschoolers learned that through prayer, God's children can praise him, ask for forgiveness, pray for others and ask for the good things they need. They learned that God's children need to pray. Ask God to help you guide your child as he or she learns to put thanks and requests into words, and learns more and more about what it means to talk to our loving heavenly Father, and listen to his voice through his Word.



Projects for you & your child this week . . .



- Make a prayer calendar. Write down the names of missionaries, people who are ill and others with special needs. Each day of the week, pray for the person or family listed, and keep track of your prayers and God's answers.
- Make a prayer collage. Draw a big heart on poster board and cut it out. Glue pictures of relatives, friends, missionaries and church members onto the heart. Punch a hole in the top center of the heart. Thread yarn or ribbon through the hole. Tie it so that the collage can be hung to remind your family to pray for relatives, friends and church members.
